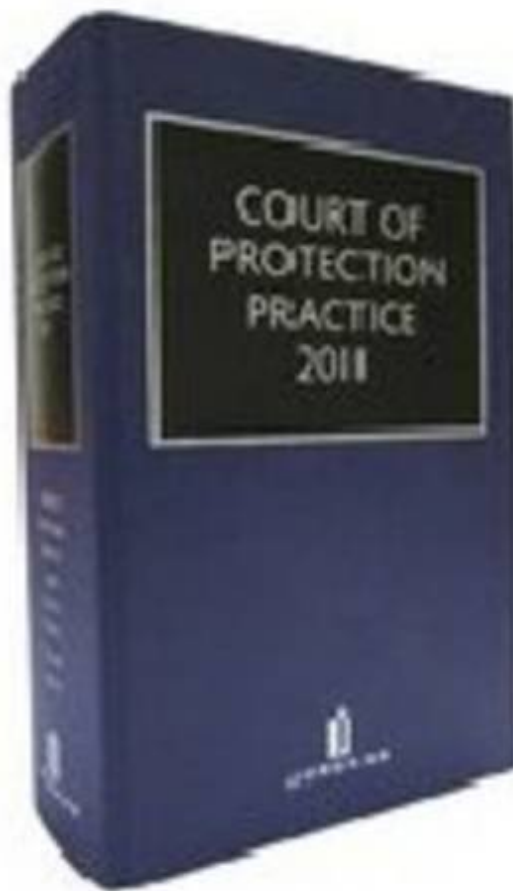

And while, as author Gordon Ashton observes, there has been little change to the legislative

material or Rules and Practice Directions during 2010 case law has continued to develop and (has) thrown up a few surprises which are covered in the narrative, annotations and case summaries. This latest edition of Court of Protection Practice therefore provides a detailed and authoritative guide to judges as well as practitioners involved in cases that come before the body that is now referred to as the new Court of Protection, which, as it continues to grow, now involves an increasing number of -- and a wider range of -- lawyers. The new Court of Protection, which includes a regional presence, was established by the Mental Capacity Act 2005 and as a consequence, raised standards are expected from practitioners. In the light of these changes, certain aspects of the previous edition of this volume have been re-organised and incorporated into the new. A significant and important change is the inclusion of a new Part X, the International section which covers relevant procedures in a selection of European and Commonwealth countries, together with an updated narrative on Scottish law and procedure. In addition, there is input from experienced lawyers in a number of jurisdictions on issues relating to how, for example, to deal with an adult from England or Wales who becomes incapacitated while abroad, or owning property abroad. A quick perusal of the contents of this meticulously researched volume conveys merely a partial idea of its immense scope. Coverage in Part I alone includes the mental capacity jurisdiction lasting powers of attorney the powers of the Court deprivation of liberty safeguards and the Public Guardian. The contents of Parts II X present the full panoply of essential materials from the procedural guides and the Mental Capacity Act 2005, to codes of practice, precedent orders, case summaries and forms. As you would expect from a reference work of this thoroughness and scope, there are extensive tables of statutes, statutory instruments, cases, practice directions and codes of practice as well as a Table of EC and international regulations.
