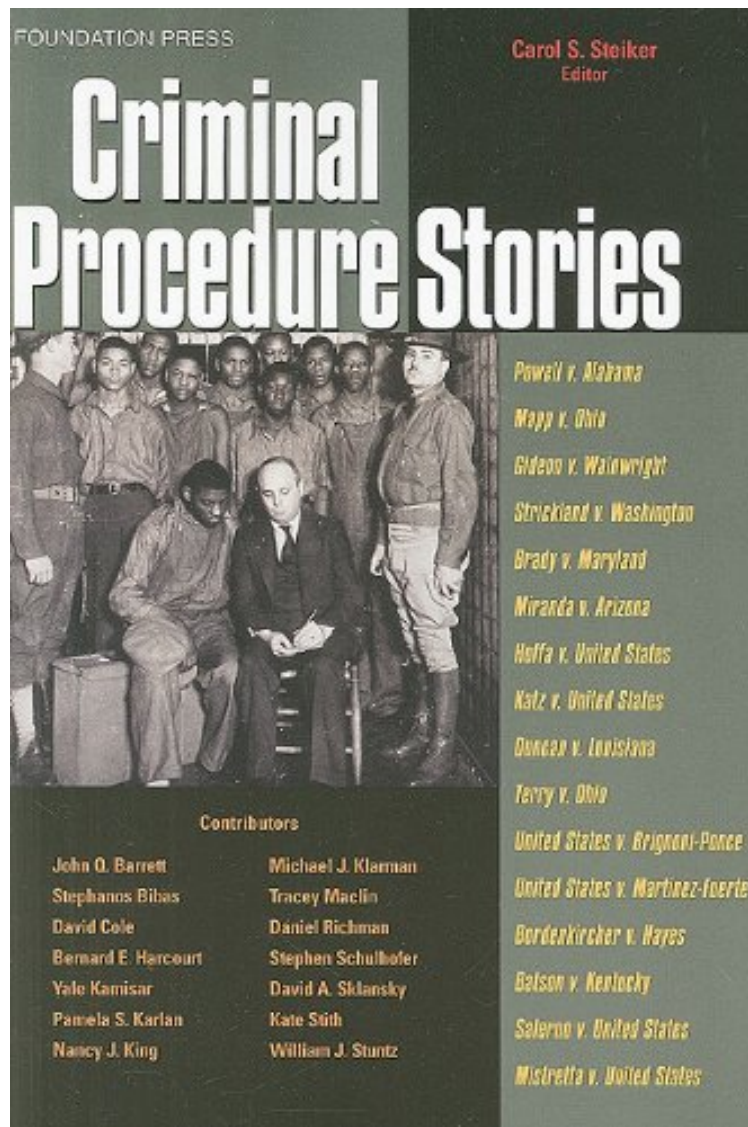

This was an optional book for a class I was taking, so there was a little difficulty in matching the recommended page numbers on the syllabus with those of the version I was attempting to read. I don't fault the book, this is a software issue - just wanted to make sure that potential buyers are aware of the fact. Anyway, on to the substance: this is a good book. It really makes some of the dry opinions that you read in the textbook come to life with lots of well written and researched background and history of the cases. You get a much better picture of the litigation strategies and social/cultural climate that surrounded these cases. I would recommend.

Unlike casebooks, this title provides rich narrative detail of the human stories and the social, political, and legal contexts of notable Supreme Court cases on criminal justice. It includes details not available elsewhere, and offers the insights of respected scholars who are experts on the particular cases and issues they address. This book will greatly enhance the teaching both of police practices (a.k.a "Cops and Robbers") and of criminal adjudication (a.k.a "Bail to Jail").
