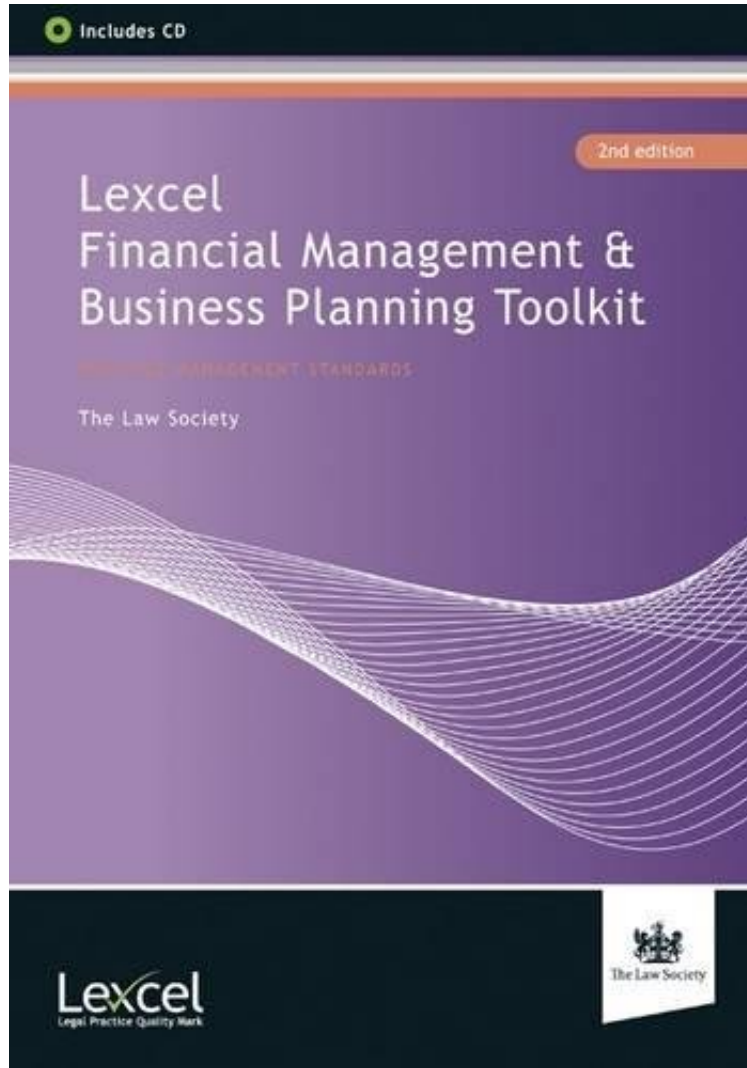

The purpose of the paperback is current cyber security advice for those engaged in law firm management.Users would

include practice managers, partners and directors and all members of Counsel. The area under scrutiny includes cyber security threats and management. Wright's intention is to make information technology accessible and understandable to readers who do not have such a background. The experienced IT professional will find the legal and regulatory standards covered in chapter five helpful to identify appropriate solutions for those advising either in-house or supplying such services to law firms. We found that the author gives practitioners an excellent feel for the type of structures which they need so that any cyber security risks are well managed and identified in accordance with the principles of good governance for any firm, legal or non-legal because the subject-matter is widely misunderstood with few experts in the field. The problem which Wright identifies is that cyber threats are continuing to evolve all the time so there is a need for up to the moment advice with current sources and links set out at the end of the book. For the digital world we now face, firms should possess clear and rigorous safeguarding policies for intellectual property, the holding of client data and other legal information as a fundamental part of their business strategy. For instance, just consider Principle 10 of the SRA code whereby regulated firms have a responsibility to 'protect client money and assets' and cyber crime presents a significant risk to this. Therefore, cyber security has emerged as a central issue for professional indemnity insurers. Firms are expected to demonstrate what protections they have built against cyber criminals before they are offered cover, hence the need for this toolkit. Its aim is to cover both the law and its practical application and it will help ensure that your firm has effective policies and procedures in place to deal with cyber security. We consider that this toolkit manual will assist your firm by increasing awareness of and be prepared for cyber incidents and the threats they pose, as well as how to prevent and deal with them. Wright gives excellent assistance and advice to help your firm's staff comply with all their information security obligations which includes cyber security. Whilst suggesting safeguards for digital information from both external and internal sources and examples of how to deal with issues such as information breaches in the workplace, the detailed Annexes throughout each chapter give precedents and templates on the CD-ROM. These Annexes make sure that you meet all current legal and regulatory requirements to protect your personal and client data covering the main core areas of cyber crime risk audit; mobile technology policy; email security policy; and IT security checklist. The date of publication is 2016 although beware of the fast moving changes in cyber security and ensure you are as up to date as possible with managing breaches.
