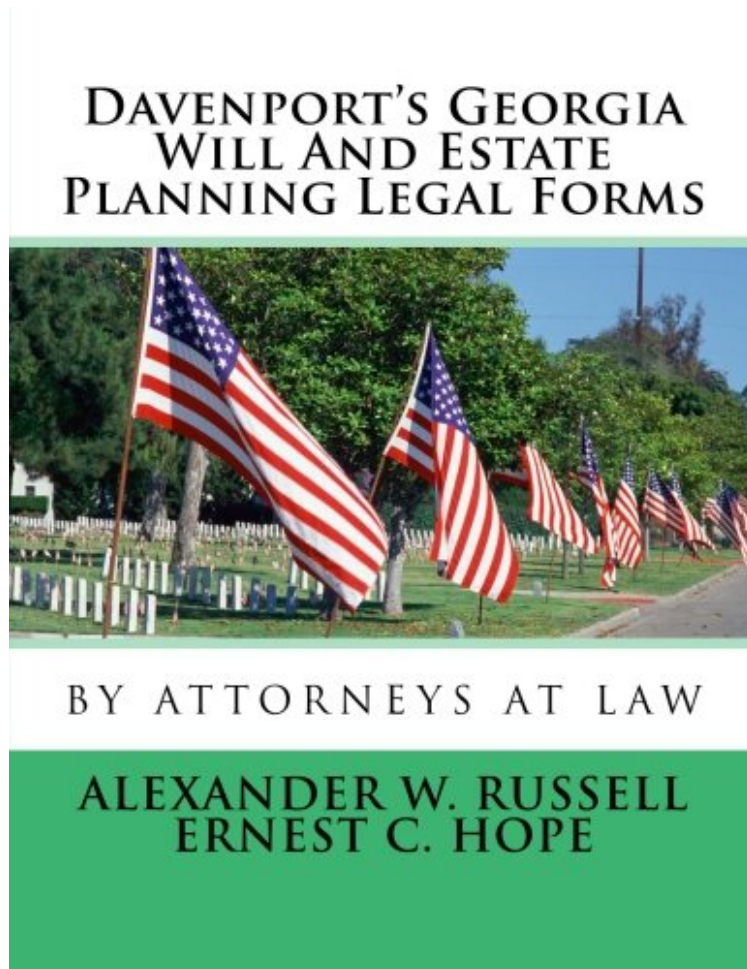

Forms to make binding legal documents in this book and for download include: 1) Last Will and Testament (lets one give orders to at death gift property, select guardians for minor children and others, and control other matters); 2) Self-Proving Affidavit (this common standard form helps show Will was signed correctly), 3) Georgia Advance Directive

For Health Care (like a Living Will lets instructions be given and person named to control ones health care in case needed); 4) Georgia Statutory Form For Financial Power Of Attorney (lets power over money, property, and other matters be shared with another person so they can help do things); 5) Georgia Power Of Attorney For Care Of A Minor (lets power over childs schooling, health care, and more be shared with grandparents or great-grandparents, often used if parents will be away); 6) Power Of Attorney Delegating Parental Authority (lets power over childs schooling, health care, and more be shared with any person like friend, teacher, relative, babysitter, or other, often used if parents will be away); 7) Designation To Control Remains (lets person give instructions and pick person to control funeral, cremation, burial, and related matters); and 8) Do-Not-Resuscitate and P.O.L.S.T. (shows paramedics and any medical personnel whether to try to restart the heart, try to restart breathing, and try other major actions).
