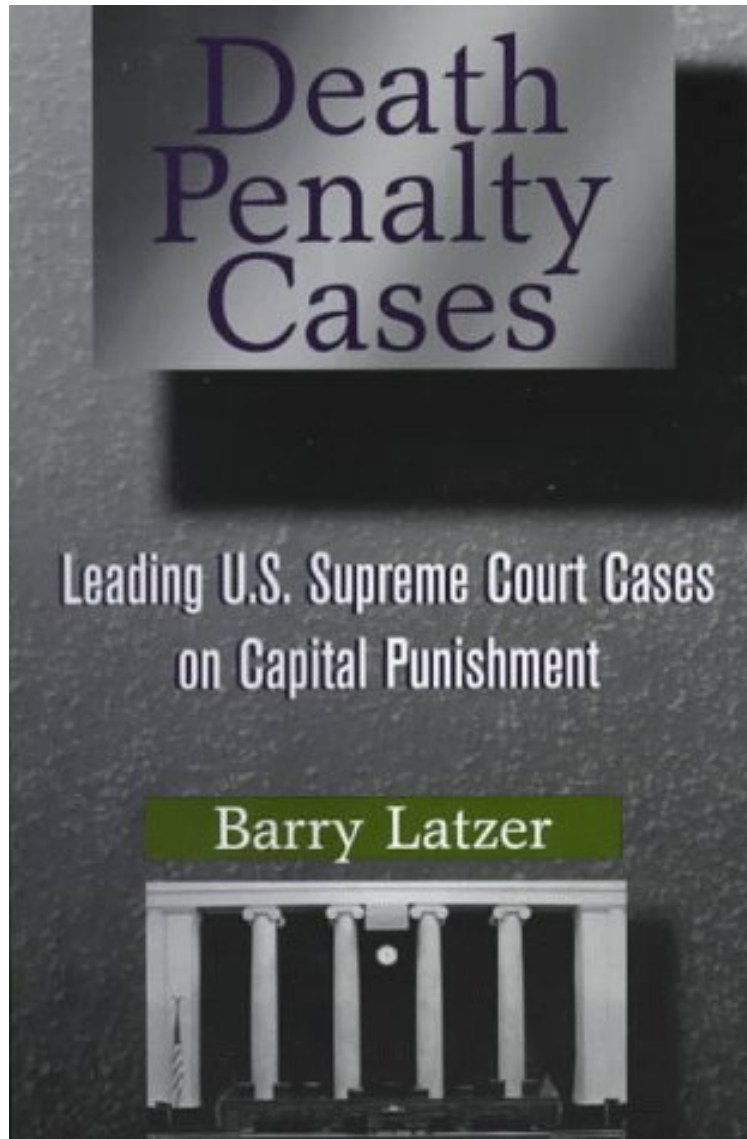


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Barry Latzer, JD, Ph.D., is a senior Professor of Government at John Jay College of Criminal Justice and the Graduate Center of the City University of New York, where he teaches courses on the death penalty, criminal justice, and criminal law. He is the author of numerous articles on criminal law and two books, *State Constitutional Criminal Law* and *State Constitutions and Criminal Justice*. Professor Latzer is also known for his work on state constitutional law, which is the subject of two of his books, *State Constitutional Criminal Law* (Clark, Boardman, Callaghan, 1995), and *State Constitutions and Criminal Justice* (Greenwood, 1991). He has published over two dozen scholarly articles and writes a continuing series of articles for the *Criminal Law Bulletin*, entitled "State Constitutional Developments."
