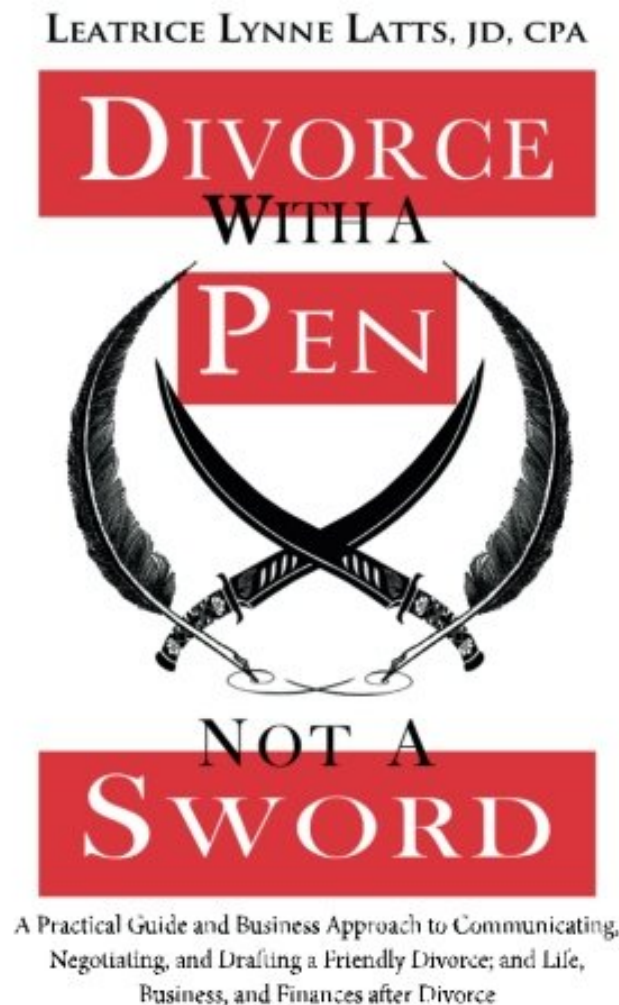

Think about famous divorce cases that hit the headlines. Yes, she got millions of dollars. But the lawyers also got millions of dollars. Sure, the husband paid both his and her legal fees, but every dollar that went to the attorneys and the accountants, appraisers, and other expert witnesses, was a dollar gone from the marital pot. What if, instead of the soap opera court litigated divorce, wife had communicated and negotiated with husband for a business partnership dissolution? 1. Both parties would have more money. 2. There would be less acrimony, less stain on everyone, including the kids. In order to successfully divorce with a business approach, you need: 1. An attitude adjustment from divorce to dissolution, from soap opera to business, from win-lose to win-win. 2. Business oriented attorneys and advisers. 3. A basic understanding of business, finance, and accounting. 4. Knowledge of both business and interpersonal communication techniques. 5. Contracts and agreements that pass muster business-wise in that they are clear, easily enforceable, and even-handed. That's what "Divorce with a Pen, Not a Sword" advocates and teaches- with practical advice, war stories, and step by step how-to's. However, before you can be successful in divorcing with a pen instead of a sword, energy must be considered. Look again at those high profile divorce cases. Over the years, Leatrice's law practice expanded to business and financial consulting. She was able to incorporate the experience she had received interacting with clients and businesses as a CPA. 3. She expanded her word-smithing abilities: Contracts so clear that the other side doesn't feel the need to take them to their attorney; Memorializing, as a "ghost writer", the thoughts, positions, negotiations, even speeches, and persuasions that her Clients wanted to communicate to others. 4. She focused on inter-personal communication techniques: "I" messages versus "you" messages; negotiation versus power plays; positions versus value judgments; role playing; avoiding rescue trips; finding the silver linings. 5. She employed business communication principles: Deal points versus negotiating points; good guy/ bad guy games; serving as a sounding board; keeping the doors open. 6. Gradually, Leatrice discovered her sensitivity to energy and her intuitive knowing how to help her Clients. She became a "path of least resistance", channeling the words and solutions that her Clients were meant to hear. 7.
