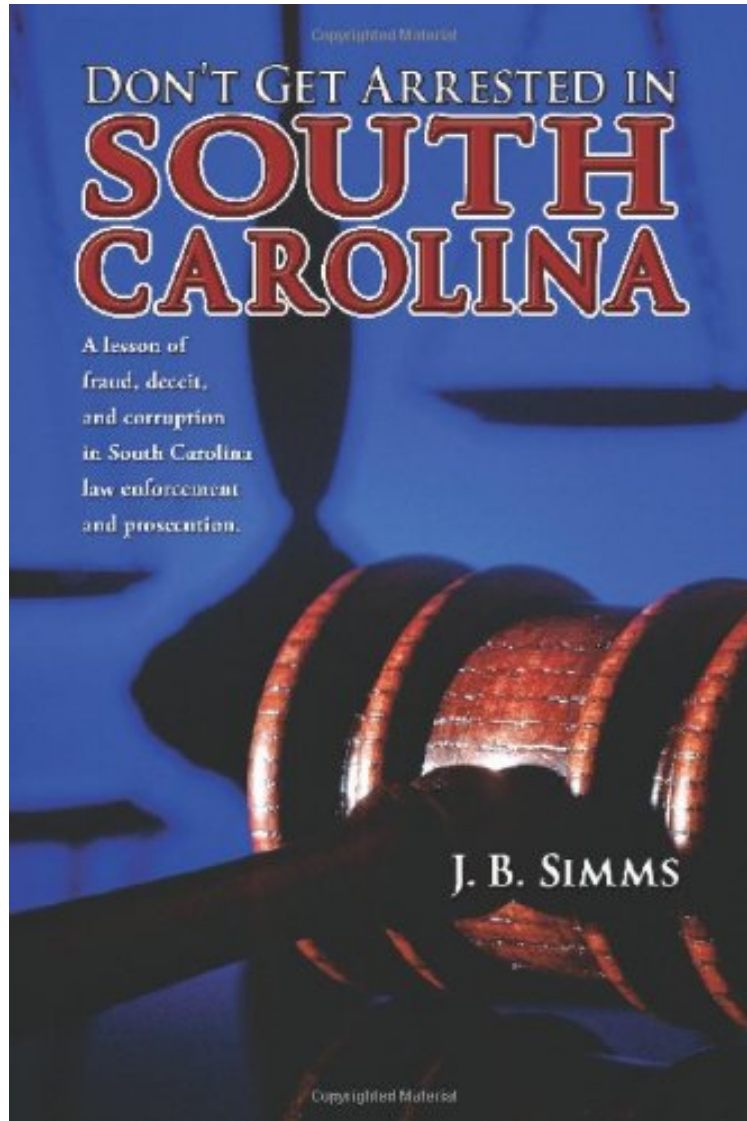

A good read with high quality printing, although not offering hard cover is annoying. The book feels like Valery Plame's book - an enjoyable read, but at times, over the top. A must read nonetheless.

Dr. Harry Sunshine was a loved and respected childrens dentist in Columbia, S.C. He was loved by his wife, children, family, and everyone with whom he came in contact. Everyone assumed Dr. Sunshine would continue his prominent roll in the community and live a long and healthy life. This assumption was shattered on the morning of Sept. 30, 2003 when he was struck by a vehicle and left to die on the side of the road. Over a month later, Charles and Tshona Outlaw were arrested and charged with involvement in the death of Dr. Harry Sunshine. Tshona was charged with hit and run while Charles was charged with owning the vehicle which struck Dr. Sunshine. Newspapers printed their photographs and local television reported detailed stories about their identities, given to them by local law enforcement. In this case the local media gathered information from the authorities and believed it to be true. If you believe everything you read and hear then you have no need to read this book. If you want to live your life believing that you can trust everything you are told by someone in authority, then you won't want to read this book; it would be far too frightening to you. This book is the true account of the investigation of the death of Dr. Sunshine, and the attempt to convict an innocent man to protect the identity of the guilty. The investigation headed by author JB Simms revealed information that not only implicated the law enforcement community, but also prison officials, defense attorneys, inmates and former inmates, and bank officials. It also involved police officers and elected officials misplacing and destroyed documents, and the filing of false affidavits.
