This is the kind of book which results when writers with no specialized knowledge of a subject are commissioned by a publisher to research and write a book to fill a gap in a series. "Euthanasia: Second Edition" (2008) is based almost solely on secondary sources and virtually no primary material which is not available on the Internet. The "credits" on page xiii thank all the good folks in the publishing company and area libraries for their help -- but do not credit a single expert in the pro- or anti-euthanasia field whom they could have contacted for direct quotations and succinct, up-to-date opinions. Example: all the information about the 1997 legalization of euthanasia in the Republic of Colombia comes not from the report of the Colombian Constitutional Court which approved it, or from the doctors there who practice it, or from Colombian medical journals, but from reports by Television New Zealand (7,500 miles away!) and the San Diego Union Tribune! For a reference book, this is shameful. Entire major issues are left unaddressed, such as the development in 1999 of safe, efficient, legal methods of self-deliverance by the NuTech Group, a primary advocate for personal autonomy at the end of life. Another area almost wholly ignored is the will of the people in the Western world, approximately 75% of whom support the right of a terminally ill person with less than six months of expected life expectancy to end their lives when, where, and how they choose. It is also not noted that despite the will of the people, their elected representatives generally refuse to enact the laws their constituents demand. Those with serious interests in the subject of euthanasia and physician-hastened death would do well to look elsewhere.

Although some of the reading is slow going (laws and documents), the text is well written and objective. Case studies are presented in a straightforward manner and include extensive documentation and attributable quotes. The chapters dealing with euthanasia in other countries and biographical information on key figures are especially helpful. Other sections focus on periodicals, non-print material, organizations, and the Internet. The tables, graphs, and maps clearly present statistics that can often be confusing.
