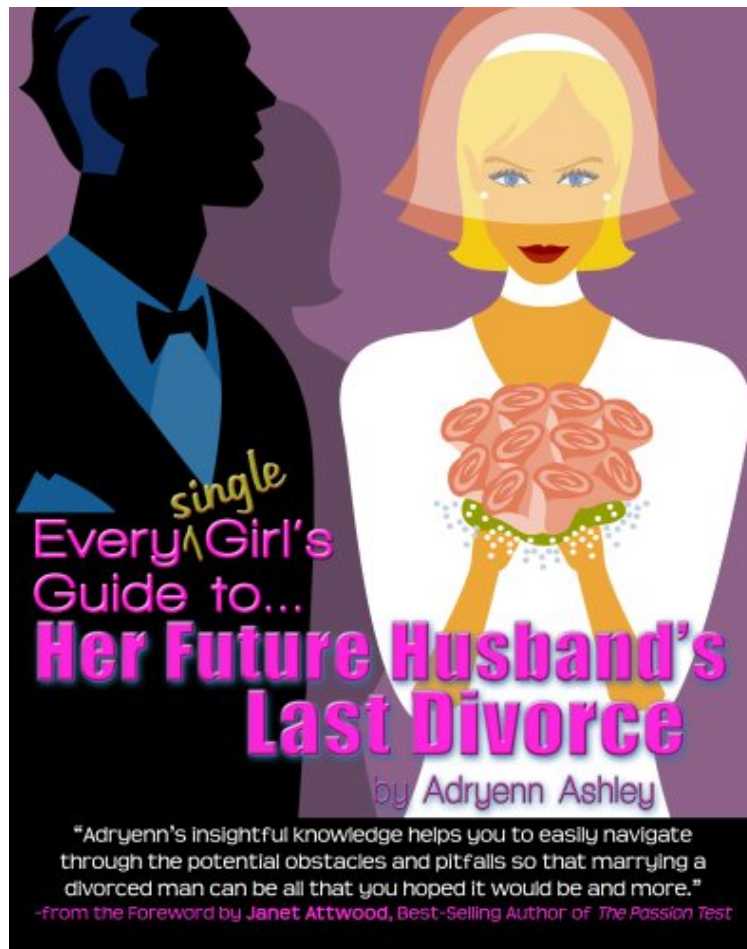

From the start I suggested getting a prenup so that he felt his kids would always be taken care of, no matter what happened to him and to our marriage. We decided to see a family lawyer to help us with it, but I wanted to discuss it with my partner in advance, and bring specific talking points to our meeting.I started reading this book hoping to find a to-do list of things to check out and conversations to have. Oh boy, did I find it! Half way into it I was sick to my stomach with concern and convinced that everyone was out to get me - my partner, the ex, the kids,

the government, our future lawyers... Paranoia is not great when you're working on a prenup and about to get married. Pros - she gives it to you like it is and if you have any reasons to be suspicious or worried, then this is the book for you. Does your partner have a horrible relationship with his ex? Is he clueless about his divorce conditions or finances? She'll give you the tools to look into and settle everything. If you have quite a lot of estate, then by all means, make sure you're protected or get out before it's too late. Cons - the horror stories were really eating me up. I don't consider myself to be naive, but this book opened up a whole new world for me, and I was happier when I let go of it. I read other books on the matter, of which I recommend the simple and sometimes "warm and fuzzy" *What to Do Before I Do: The Modern Couple's Guide to Marriage, Money and Prenups* and we're using family lawyers to help us finalize our prenup, but this book was more than I could handle. KINDLE NOTE - the formatting for this book is a little messed up, which complicated reading. There were highlighted sections in title style that were completely out of place, so I felt like I read certain parts twice. Also, she gives you many lists that would be easier to deal with on paper. It's called being prepared, not being paranoid By owlwings I have read this book 3 times, and I keep finding new gems. The author certainly did her homework! I have used the information in my own life in my upcoming marriage to a 2x divorced man with children (and one marriage was considered long term), and have referred to the book several times in helping friends through their own divorces, successfully. I am not a lawyer, and neither is the author, however her research is sound. The family court system is no joke, and not to be taken lightly if you are embarking on a marriage to someone who is previously divorced, and especially if they have children, and especially if they were in what is considered to be a long term marriage. You DO NOT want your income to be tied together with someone else's, especially in cases where alimony can be awarded long after the fact, and child support can be recalculated. Yep! Your income can be calculated in with your new husband's income, for child support arrangements! This from [...]: "Some states, such as California, take into account a new spouse's income when making child support payment determinations only in extraordinary cases. Extraordinary cases are defined as unemployment, underemployment, income reduction, and/or other reliance upon a new spouse's income." As an example, I sat in child support court in Modesto, CA with one of my employees in June 2012. Many of the men and women in the courtroom claimed unemployment, or inability to work due to whatever reason, or recent income reduction. I listened to the judge ask person after person who they were living with, who their new wife/husband was, and when the answer was yes, or a name given, the judge then asked why they had not submitted their new combined spousal and combined live-in girlfriend/boyfriend income yet. The judge even asked this over the phone to the men who were now living out of state. Who are you living with? Are you re-married? and so on... So you think that the ex won't ask for more, based on her own unemployment, underemployment, or income reduction? Or based on these same extraordinary circumstances when your new husband's own income gets reduced somehow? That would be a very, very trusting way of thinking. I would call Ms. Ashley's book a preparedness guide, and certainly not a tome of paranoia. She gives great advice on how to set your finances up so that you can make it work. Read those divorce papers of your husband to be! Seriously! Follow her guidance, and do your due diligence. You will not regret it. Is some of what she says scary? Yep! Does she empower you, as a single, successful woman, to take charge of your own future? Yep! Remember, a man is not a plan! Nor should you be his ex-wife's plan!!
