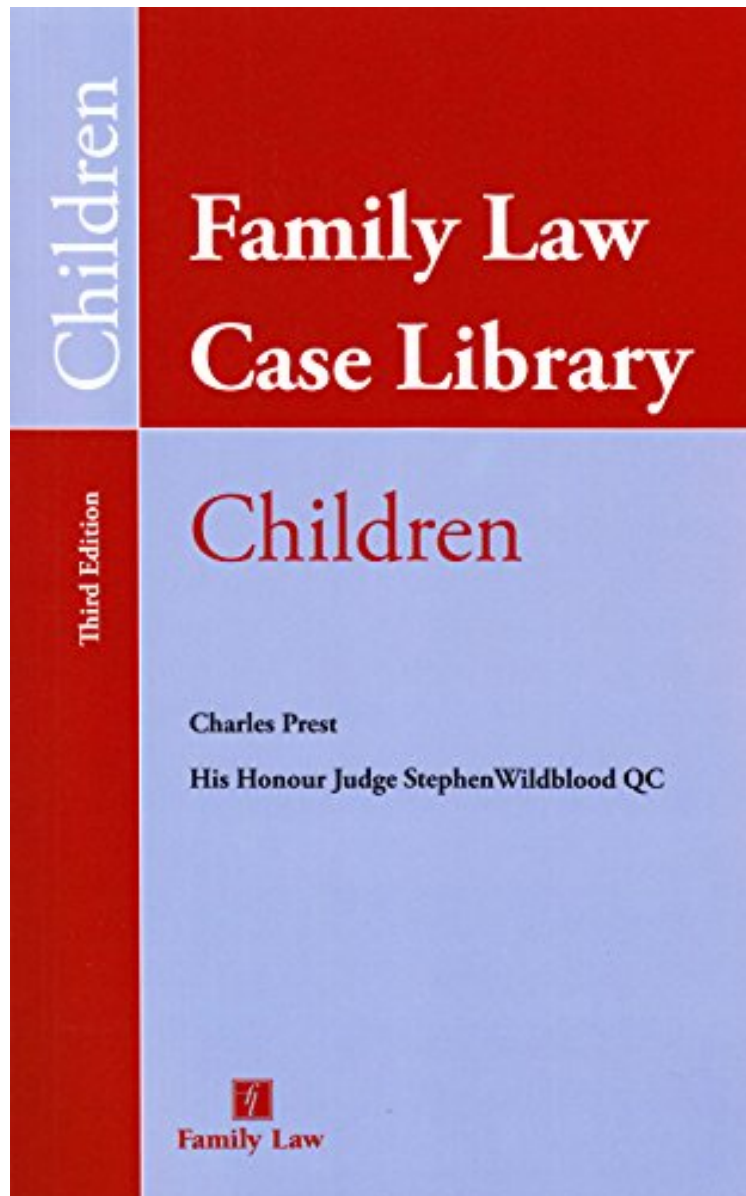

## MBEAN INDISPENSABLE WORK OF REFERENCE FOR PRACTITIONERS IN CHILDREN LAW

An appreciation by Phillip Taylor MBE and Elizabeth Taylor of Richmond Green Chambers. Few aspects of family law are as sensitive or as complex as cases involving children. Practitioners in Children Law will therefore welcome the new third edition of this well known and well regarded work of reference on which so many family lawyers have come to depend. Published by Jordans Family Law imprint, it has been called a case law digest and so it is; it is a digest of the FLR (Family Law Reports). With a view to saving much time and effort for busy practitioners, this impressively large volume is impressively well organized too, making it a lot easier for the lawyer or legal researcher to look up relevant and pertinent case material in support of a skeleton argument, for example, or a conference, or a hearing. Taking account, as it does, of all FLR cases up to the end of 2014, this brand new edition is completely up to date. As the editors point out, it sets out only the key extracts from the key judgments, those that are most often applied by the courts in England and Wales. If you are approaching this book for the first time, you would be well advised to have a quick read of the preface, followed by a perusal of the detailed table of contents which indicates the logical structure of the book. Like the FLCLC, (Family Law Case Library: Children) the contents have been arranged thematically in nine Divisions which constitute categories from A to I. Divisions A to D encompass the Children Act 1989. Divisions E, F and G deal respectively with adoption, abduction and case management, while the final two divisions cover judgment, costs and appeals and miscellaneous issues. You will also find the index at the back helpful in steering you in the right direction toward the commentary you are looking for, including, interestingly, the meaning of family life and private life. As you would expect from a reference book of this magnitude and authority, there are over fifty pages containing tables of cases, statutes and statutory instruments, plus a handy list of abbreviations and key dates. Also note the CD-ROM attached to the inside back cover, which contains all the extracts contained in the book, which you can copy and paste as necessary into whatever documentation you need to print out for court. Any practitioners specializing in children law, or wishing to, will find this book indispensable, both as an authoritative work of reference and an enlightening read. The publication date is cited as at June 2015.

In the UK, busy family law practitioners find that - whether in preparation for a conference, in drafting a skeleton argument, or before setting off to court - they repeatedly have to search for the same authorities and the same crucial paragraphs within each authority. The Family Law Case Library (Children) addresses this need by providing a quick method of sourcing the key extracts from the seminal UK authorities, all collated in a single volume and presented thematically with cross-references to the full case report in the Family Law Reports. Also included is a CD-ROM containing all of the extracts found in the book, ideal for copying and pasting when preparing documents, such as skeleton arguments, or for printing and submitting in court.
